WHERE IS THE AWE?

Scripture reading: Ex 19:14-18

- I. Today we live in a society that sets very little aside to hold in respect, to honor or consider sacred, especially concerning God and spiritual matters.
 - a. It is okay to lie, be deliberately biased or prejudiced and to deceive others.
 - b. Nothing is above ridicule or mockery, little if anything is trustworthy.
 - c. Everything done seems to be for some self-serving reason.
- II. For all their faults, flaws, and failures, Old Testament Israel at times did hold God in awe. A sense of that awe can be found in their journey to Jerusalem three times a year by their words in the singing of psalms.

A. **Deuteronomy 16:16-17:**

- a. All of the adult men of Old Testament Israel were commanded to make a pilgrimage to Jerusalem for national sacrificial worship threes times each year.
 - a. At the time of the feasts of Passover, Pentecost and Tabernacles.
- b. Families could accompany them.
- B. In the book of Psalms there is a collection of psalms (Psalm 120 to Psalm 134) that are known as the songs of ascents.
 - a. These are probably the words they sang on their pilgrimage.
 - b. Here are some of those Psalms. Listen to these verses in their songs as they gathered to praise and honor God. Listen to the awe.
